In fiscal year 2019, CRS implemented a **\$154 million portfolio** of malaria programs worldwide, reaching more than **86 million beneficiaries** in 12 countries.

COLLECT DATA USING MOBILE APPS

Approximately 60 percent of CRS' malaria programs use mobile technology to improve speed and accuracy of data collection, enable simple analysis and use of complex data, or increase adherence to malaria treatment guidelines.



MOVE TOWARD ELIMINATION

CRS has supported malaria programming in The Gambia over the last 14 years, which has contributed to a 97.5% reduction in malaria prevalence from 4% in 2010 to 0.1% in 2017. The Gambia is now a step closer to eliminating malaria.



Since 2014, CRS has supported national malaria control programs in six countries (Cameroon, Guinea, Mali, Niger, Nigeria and The Gambia) in the scale-up of seasonal malaria chemoprevention. Over the last 5 years, CRS has supported the distribution of **22 million doses** to children under five years of age.
