IMPROVING EDUCATION, STUDENT HEALTH AND EXPANDING SCHOOL FEEDING PROGRAMS

CRS : Vision 2030

CRS aims to increase school enrollment, attendance, quality of education and reduce dropout rates by providing school meals, creating “green schools” to mitigate the effects of climate change and improving improving water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) in schools.

Goals

Project MaMi aims to improve the quality of education, student health and the expansion of school feeding programs.


MaMi will target two districts: Farafangana and Vondrozo, in the Atsimo Atsinanana (AA) region in the southeast of the country.

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) Catholic Relief Services (CRS) is implementing the five-year “Mavitrika Mianatra” project which means “motivated to learn” in Malagasy. The project is in collaboration with the Government of Madagascar (GoM) designed to achieve the Government of Madagascar’s goals of improving the sustainable school system.

MaMi will be the second McGovern-Dole program implemented by CRS, Global Communities (GC), FHI 360 and Sofiasive as consortium partners.

Expected Results

- 80,805 primary and pre-school students receive daily school meals for four years
- 185 reading corners for 80,805 students and 1,220 teachers
- 7,400 storybooks for kindergarten students distributed
- 1,220 teachers trained
- 185 school gardens and nurseries created
- 580 Saving and Internal Lending Groups formed.
- 54 schools have improved water sources
- 71 latrine blocks repaired and/or built
