

Participants in the Nuwaki project proudly display a symbol of social cohesion in the Matéri community in Northern Benin, highlighting their commitment to unity and collaboration. To promote reconciliation and peaceful coexistence among communities in cross border areas, CRS and its partner Caritas Natitingou conducted a four-day training. The training's approach fosters reconciliation, trauma healing and social cohesion through the Nuwaki project. This initiative brought together a wide range of participants, including halogen farmers, indigenous farmers, cattle herders as well as religious and political-administrative authorities. The Nuwaki project, signifying "union" in the Biali language, seeks to prevent violent conflict along the Benin-Togo border by strengthening resilience and cross-border cooperation in a region affected by extremist violence emanating from the Sahel crisis.

CRS staff in Niger celebrated Community Day with a tree planting exercise at the Girls' School in Sassoumbroum, catalyzing enthusiastic local community participation. This initiative underscores CRS' responsiveness as a non-state service provider in a country facing significant biodiversity challenges. CRS Niger implemented the USAID GIRMA project, which aimed to enhance and support food and nutrition security, as well as the resilience of extremely poor and chronically vulnerable households. Since 2018, the GIRMA project has been active in the Magaria and Dungass departments in the Zinder-Niger region, covering 11 municipalities and reaching approximately 900,000 direct participants.





Raimundo dos Santos Filho is a community leader and local fisherman in São José do Pampolha, Brazil. He stands together with his family in a supermarket, showing a multipurpose cash assistance debit card after finalizing their food purchase. Continuous drought has caused severe water and food shortage in Amazonas State. To respond to the immediate needs of vulnerable individuals and families, Caritas Brazil prioritizes multipurpose cash assistance, or MPCA. CRS technically accompanies Partners in Latin America to implement these types of market-based responses that help households meet many of their main needs and allow them to live in dignity. At the end of this intervention, 132 households affected by the drought will have been assisted with a one-time MPCA transfer worth \$320.



The Faces Behind the Numbers

Emeri Pirwach employs traditional smearing techniques to finish the interior walls of her home in Uganda's Kyangwali refugee settlement. This method, usually led by women, uses a mix of clay and sand to protect adobe bricks from cracking and eroding, increasing their durability. CRS' construction programs build on existing traditional building techniques, like smearing, and promote the use of locally available materials and the technical skills of local builders. Uganda, one of the largest asylum countries worldwide, hosts over 1.7 million refugees, mainly from South Sudan and the Democratic Republic of Congo. In 2024, CRS supported Congolese households like Emeri's to build 250 adobe homes, providing them with a safe and dignified place to live.







The Faces Behind the Numbers

A woman receives food assistance from CRS and USAID in Tigray. In Ethiopia, an estimated 15.8 million people are currently experiencing severe food insecurity. Among them, 3.9 million are located in Tigray, where the aftermath of recent conflict has hindered the recovery of household food supplies and incomegenerating activities. This has exacerbated an already dire situation as the country confronts yet another escalating food security crisis. The Joint Emergency Operation, or JEOP, is a USAID-funded emergency food assistance initiative aimed at addressing transient food insecurity among the most susceptible households in designated communities in Ethiopia. It covers up to 33% of crisis-affected woredas in five regions and one city administration.





The Faces Behind the Numbers

A program participant works on soil and water conservation infrastructure in the Harkeya watershed area, located in Meta Woreda, Gemechu Duse Kebele. Many regions in Ethiopia have been severely impacted by land degradation due to inadequate land management practices, rugged topography and heavy rainfall. Consequently, many communities face significant challenges to their livelihoods as they witness water scarcity and the gradual loss of fertile farmlands to soil erosion. CRS, funded by USAID, has worked with the Ifaa Resilience Food Security Activity initiative since 2022 to implement soil and water conservation measures. These efforts target 34 learning watershed sites, including the Harkeya watershed area.



A group of women gather in a Savings and Internal Lending Community, or SILC, session in Baja Verapaz, Guatemala. Emergency projects in Guatemala help people to survive emergencies with dignity and rebuild their lives, livelihoods and homes as quickly as possible. CRS works with local partners on projects that have assisted families with the highest rates of food insecurity in the Dry Corridor in Chiquimula and Baja Verapaz and the Polochic Valley in Alta Verapaz, Guatemala. These households often carry a significant debt burden, lack of savings, are heavily dependent on food purchases and have falling purchasing power due to rising prices of food, fuel and agricultural supplies.



The Hadomi Osan group, located in Halderai-Uma Wain Craic, Viqueque Municipality, Timor-Leste, has 28 members in its Savings and Internal Lending Community, or SILC. The group's horticulture activities benefit family members by providing healthy, fresh food and the SILC contributes income to fulfill their basic needs. CRS Timor-Leste, with funding from the Margaret A. Cargill Philanthropies, implemented the HAKOREN project from March 2020 to December 2023. The project aimed to increase the resilience of vulnerable groups and responsible local governments in the face of recurring low-attention disasters. It was implemented in nine villages across the municipality of Viqueque with a target of 500 households and 1,000 farmers.



Sarah Mokane plays with her son, Jean Claude, under an insecticide-treated net at her home in the Pointe Noire department of the Republic of the Congo. Her family recently received the net for free as part of the Global Fund's malaria project, which CRS leads in coordination with the Ministry of Health. The project aims to reduce the human and socio-economic burden of malaria, which is the country's leading cause of death, with pregnant women and children under 5 at the greatest risk. "We are so happy to receive these nets," says Sarah. "The quality is much better [than nets you pay for at the market]. They protect us better. Malaria is a threat to my whole family, so this is helping us."



Symbolizing hope and protection, children's handprints decorate the walls of the Child Helpline call center in Maseru, Lesotho. The Child Helpline is a toll-free, 24-hour hotline where anyone can report cases of child neglect or abuse, which disproportionately affect children living with or affected by HIV. The helpline, staffed by trained social workers, is crucial for providing immediate support and intervention for vulnerable children. Implemented in partnership with Lesotho's Ministry of Gender and Social Development, the helpline is part of the PEPFAR-funded Karabo Ea Bophelo project, which supports children and families living with and affected by HIV.



CRS is implementing a four-year project funded by Growing Hope Globally and Fair Trade in Mbeya District Council, Tanzania. The GHG project aims to enhance youth and private sector engagement in sustainable agricultural production, household food security and livelihood improvements.



Nine-year-old Susanna Varlee fetches water for her family in Bensville community, Kakata city in Liberia's Margibi country. Susanna's mother previously did not let her fetch water because clean water sources were over an hour away. In the dry season, even those sources often dried up or became muddy. Then in 2022, CRS built a solar-powered water supply facility in the Bensville community, only three minutes away from their home. Clean drinking water is now available all year round. CRS Liberia's HELPS project addresses the issue of lack of access to drinking water. Undertaken in partnership with a local implementing partner and government agencies, the project rehabilitates and builds stand-alone solar-powered water supply systems and aims to provide safe drinking water to at least 10,000 people.





Implemented by CRS, in partnership with the Ministry of Education and Sport and WFP, with funding from the USDA, the School Lunch Project (SLP) supports over 249 vulnerable schools, aiming to enhance educational outcomes and build a future without food insecurity. Through the SLP, 4,000 students in 90 schools are improving their literacy skills, and healthy and nutritious meals have been served regularly to more than 28,430 children.





Macario proudly stands among the chickens he's raising. He and his brother Gabriel Ajpop Ixcoy, both from Momostenango, Guatemala, have jointly managed a poultry farm for fresh egg production since 2023. With a grant from CRS' Learning for Life III project, they were able to construct a chicken coop and successfully establish and expand their business. "We used to grow snow peas, but now we sell vegetables and eggs to schools thanks to the training we received from the Learning for Life III project," Gabriel comments. The brothers have improved their management of the farm which includes administering the right amount of feed and preventing diseases for their 500 chickens. Additionally, they generated employment for neighbors by hiring two people to work on the farm.
