THE FACES BEHIND THE NUMBERS

Carmelina is a coffee producer in the Zacapa region of Guatemala. Carmelina has used the Water Smart Agriculture (WSA) methods focused on soil and water conservation to restore a degraded coffee plantation. She says compared to other areas, the coffee plants now have more and heavier beans. "I completely restored part of [the plot] with the practices they taught me. ..organic fertilizer and cover crops are making the soil better and the harvests better too". Normally women work as day laborers, but WSA has created new opportunities empowering women in the region.

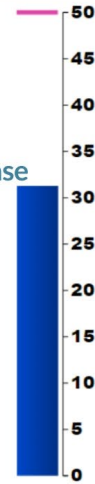

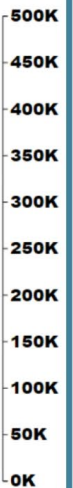

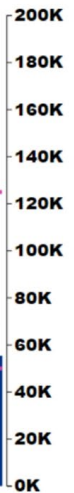

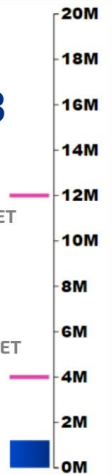

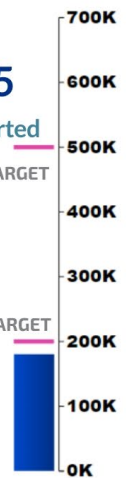

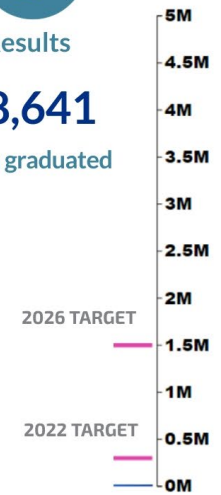

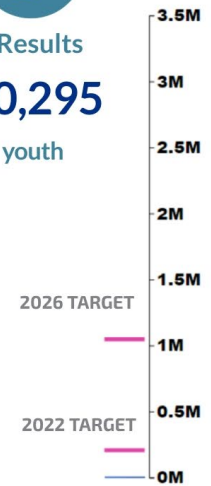
