OVERVIEW OF THE INTERNSHIP PROJECT

Unemployment is one of the greatest challenges facing young people in Sierra Leone. Young people remain one of the most marginalized group in the country - lacking access to resources, and skills development opportunities. For young women, the challenges are even greater as they have to bear traditional, cultural, economic, and social discrimination due to their gender. All these factors negatively impact on their ability to reach their highest potentials.

In alignment with CRS Sierra Leone vision 2030 strategy to promote gender equality and women's empowerment, and the government of Sierra Leone human capacity development agenda, the young women internship program seeks to invest in young women's professional development, thereby enabling them to become competent, skilled, and employable. The program offers the opportunity to gain on the job training, mentorship, relevant technical skills, and professional development geared towards enhancing their full potentials. CRS Sierra Leone hosted its first cohort of female interns in February 2021 in partnership with the National Youth Commission. In 2022, CRS will host 3 female interns for 6 months.

INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

CRS interns will have the opportunity to tailor their work to specific skills or sectors. The 2022 Interns will work alongside experienced managers to gain practical skills and experience in:

- Communications and Marketing
- Urban Resilience Programming
- Education Programming

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE PROFILE

This opportunity is open to young Sierra Leonean women with the following skills and qualifications:

- Undergraduate degree is required.
- Citizen of Sierra Leone.
- Female below 30 years of age.
- Ability to use general office equipment.
- Good oral and written communication skills.
- Committed and willingness to learn.
- Proficient in using Microsoft application software (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook).
- At least 1 year experience in the desired area (Communications and Marketing, Urban Resilience and Education related Programming).
- Commitment to serving others and desire to work in international relief and development.
- Basic photography and video editing skills. The candidate should have knowledge using Adobe applications (InDesign, Photoshop, Lightroom and Premiere) Required for the Communications role only.
