The alarming situation in the far south of Madagascar caused by climate change, recurrent droughts, and the impact of COVID-19 have resulted in 1.43 million people in southern Madagascar needing food assistance.

Catholic Relief Services received over \$10 million in funding from USAID's Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance to continue supporting communities in the Atsimo Andrefana and Androy regions.

In the dialect of the region, Rima means "to provide mutual support."

RIMA's goal is to protect households from malnutrition and loss of productive assets and to strengthen protection services and access in communes in Atsimo Andrefana and Androy regions.
