# Scope of Work for Strengthening Capacity of Women Religious on Early Childhood Development Project (SCORE- ECD II) IMBC Training and mentorship

## 1.0: Background: CRS and Implementing Partners

Catholic Relief Services (CRS), the official international humanitarian agency of US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) was founded in 1943 and carries out the commitment of the Bishops of the United States to assist the poor and vulnerable overseas in over 100 countries around the world. CRS programs assist persons based on need, regardless of creed, ethnicity or nationality and works through local church and non- church partners to implement its programs. Our Catholic identity is at the heart of our mission and operations.

#### 1.1 Project Background

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) in collaboration with partners in Ghana, Zambia, Kenya and Malawi is implementing a three-year SCORE ECD III project with support from Conrad and Hilton Foundation, through Catholic Sister organizations towards achieving the goal **children 0-3 years old in the target areas live in nurturing environments by 2024**. Phase III of the project is supporting the sustainability and leadership of 5 National Associations and 32 Congregations of Catholic Sisters in the four countries. The project is strengthening sisters' organizations, adapting and refining the SCORE model by scaling up a targeted maternal mental health component, incorporating household economic strengthening, SMART Couples interventions, and introducing a quality improvement component in Sister-managed health facilities. The project theory of change is that *if Catholic* Sisters and their organizations continue to expand and improve their technical and organizational capacities, *then* they will more effectively and sustainably provide services to caregivers of young children, *leading to* those caregivers being better able to provide nurturing care, which ultimately improves child development outcomes. At the same time, *if* Catholic Sisters and their organizations become more effective and sustainable, *then* they will be better placed to provide leadership and influence at the policy level, contributing to an enabling environment for children and families across the target countries to thrive.

### 2.0: SCORE ECD Project Goal and Strategic Objectives

The overall goal of the SCORE ECD III project is that children 0-3 years old in the target areas live in nurturing environments by 2024. The Strategic Objective are:

Objective 1: Sisters deliver nurturing care and family strengthening services to caregivers of children 0-3 by 2024

Objective 2: Caregivers of children 0-3 years old provide their children nurturing care by 2024

Objective 3: NACCS have strengthened organizational capacity by 2024

**Purpose:** The purpose of this Scope of Work is to describe the technical support needed from the consultant in facilitating the implementation, quality, and adaptation of the integration of *The* 

Mothers and Babies Course<sup>1</sup> (MBC)/integrated early childhood development (iECD) as part of the Strengthening the Capacity of Women Religious in Early Childhood Development (SCORE ECD) project.

#### **Description of the Intervention**

The iMBC/ECD curriculum is a prevention model based on cognitive behavioral therapy with the aim of supporting pregnant women and mothers with children under two years of age to become more resilient, decrease risk for future depression, and manage daily stressors effectively. In addition, the updated version of the iMBC is integrated with selected early childhood development (ECD) messages. The integration of these messages is intended to increase mothers' knowledge of the stressors associated with pregnancy and parenting young children and promote early stimulation behaviors and bonding to support child development.

The model's theory of change, posits that if mothers understand and manage their mood, engage in positive coping skills<sup>2</sup> to adapt to their internal and external realities, they will have improved mental wellbeing. Improved mood coupled with ECD knowledge and skills acquired during group sessions will lead to greater parenting self-efficacy, leading to increased uptake positive care behaviors both for the mother and the child, ultimately improving child development.

To ensure quality and fidelity of the intervention and in line with the recommendations of the previous pilots, CRS require technical assistance of a consultant from April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, to 30<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

Key activities to be accomplished by the consultant

- 1. Review final version of IMBC materials
- 2. Identify ways that SCORE ECD content can be integrated with iMBC, what materials can be deleted from this version.
- 3. Ultimately have an adapted iMBC manual for Ghana, Malawi, Zambia and Kenya that includes relevant MNCH and family strengthening contents
- 4. Virtually train SCORE ECD staff based on adapted iMBC version
- 5. Include time for feedback on additional modifications to be made to go in the field
- 6. Include time for field practice and feedback
- 7. Modify the MBC based on feedback from training
- 8. Using existing IMBC data that are already being collected in SCORE III for research purposes
  - a. The consultant will take the lead in submitting the IRB for approval of this project in SCORE III and support CPs identifying research questions.
- Provide TA to CPs teams to present and publish their findings so that others can learn from their experience.
- Facilitate collaboration with local universities and ministries of health to increase reach and scope for sustainability purposes.

The research study may be done in two phases:

a. Phase 1: is in year 1 to examine the feasibility and acceptability of the study (what does it take to start this program? Some illustrative questions are: How do you identify need for this program? This can be done by interviewing different stakeholders: providers and potential participants re: their perceptions of mental health issues for pregnant women and new mothers, and what services are needed for this group). This will be done

- during the first 7 months of implementation. The data from informant interviews can be used.
- b. Phase 2 is to analyze the data from participants to see the intervention works. This includes baseline to post-intervention quantitative and qualitative data.
- 9. Follow up with virtual (Teams/Skype) supervision for project officers
- 10. Come out with a realistic schedule for the activities to be carried out
