

EARTHQUAKE RECOVERY IN NEPAL:

cash transfers and embedded extension for improved goat shelters



- Damage to goat shelters was one of the key impacts of the earthquake on community livelihoods.
- Earthquake-affected households were not able to reconstruct goat shelters due to other competing priorities.
- Existing shelter designs **caused diseases in goats** due to poor ventilation and hygiene.



- Conditional cash transfers of \$100 per beneficiary in two distributions of \$50 each.
- Conditionalities for beneficiaries:
 - 1. Participation in orientation on hygienic shelter features.
 - 2. Construction of shelters using recommended design principles.
- Design principles promoted through training and mentoring:
 - 1. Raised platforms.
 - 2. Adequate ventilation.
- Flexibility offered to beneficiaries in choosing materials and size of goat shelters.

POSITIVE RESULTS

- 100 percent of beneficiaries across 3304 households reconstructed shelters adopting hygienic shelter principles.
- **Beneficiaries co-invested** \$80-100 in-addition to \$100 received from project.
- Strong ownership of the goat shelters is evident from regular upkeep and maintenance.
- Non-beneficiaries have adopted improved shelter design principles after witnessing **reduction in respiratory diseases** due to improved shelter design.
- 20 to 30 percent increase in herd size among most beneficiaries due to improved shelters, reduction in morbidity and decrease in distress sale.




